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Talented Halifax film maker Vicky Lawton persuaded Dead Man's Shoes star Toby Kebbell to appear in her three-minute film - part of a unique collaboration between Rankin Film Productions, Panasonic and its new Lumix GH3 camera.

The former North Halifax Grammar student, who is 27, and only graduated from Kingston University six years ago, says she went out on a limb to get Kebbell to act in Hertz - the story of a secret experiment on a prisoner.

"I have seen him in so many films and thought he was amazing. When he said yes I

was thrilled," she said of the Prince of Persia: The Sands of Time, The Sorcerer's Apprentice, War Horse and Wrath of the Titans actor.

Vicky joined Rankin in

2008 as a photographic assistant.

In 2011 she became creative director for the business's own magazine Hunger.

In addition to her work with Rankin, Vicky has directed music videos and fashion films, marking notable collaborations with bands including Alpines and designer Katie Eary.

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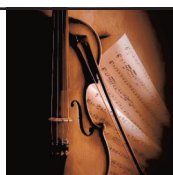
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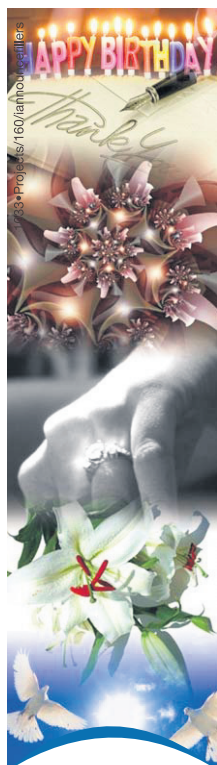
